



Barricade Fire Blocking Gel was used by several San Diego County fire departments to save a number of homes during the 2007 firestorm.

The Lake Hodges Fire Safe Council has a limited supply of Barricade Fire Blocking Gel kits available at a special price for residents in the Greater Lake Hodges Area (92029 and 92025 zip codes). The FireSafe Council is making these kits available a special price of \$145 or \$245, which is roughly \$130 to \$230 less than you can buy them from Barricade.

Requests will be filled on a first come, first served basis until our supply runs out. Barricade Gel is designed and packaged for easy homeowner use. Application is similar to spraying herbicide or pesticide -- very easy for almost anyone. The kits include an instructional video, applicator nozzle, pickup tube, quick connect and four one-gallon containers of Barricade Fire Gel.

You apply the gel using water from a garden hose, and the mixture is automatically adjusted. One gallon of fire gel covers approximately 500-700 square feet of outside wall surface with a 1/4 inch recommended thickness. Four gallons cover 2,000 to 2,800 square feet of wall area, sufficient for an average home. You can also cover sheds, foliage and other flammable materials around your home.

One box is sufficient for an average home. One and one-half or two boxes are recommended for large homes. (Three boxes can be shared by two homeowners).

The total amount of gel needed depends on siding materials, eaves, number of windows, amount of wood trim, decks, gazebos, fences, shrubs, sheds, etc. The gel is nontoxic, biodegradable, and endorsed by the EPA, and is intended to be applied prior to evacuation due to oncoming fire.

The gel can be rehydrated several times with a light water mist and remain effective up to 24 to 36 hours after application, depending on sunlight, wind and humidity conditions.
